1400 Relations between Other Governmental Agencies and the Schools

The Governing Board recognizes that agencies at all levels of government share its concern and responsibility for the welfare, health and safety of youth, and that the schools alone cannot meet children's complex individual needs. Parents/guardians, schools, local government, businesses, foundations and community-based organizations all must work together to assess needs, improve conditions for our community's youth, and ensure that the multiple services needed by children and families are coordinated so as to avoid gaps, duplication or delay.

The Board and district staff shall take every opportunity to work cooperatively with these agencies for the benefit of our students. The Superintendent or designee shall maintain good working relationships with representatives of these agencies in order to help our schools and students make use of the resources which governmental agencies can provide. The district may enter into agreements with other agencies that involve the exchange of funds or reciprocal services. Such agreements shall be approved by the Board and executed in writing.

The Board may participate in collaborative relationships with city and county leaders to develop local policies and provide effective multi-agency programs that respond to the needs of children and families.

The Superintendent and staff shall cooperate with public and private agencies as they attempt to effectively implement child care, after-school programs, nutrition, health and other services for children.
